This current bruhaha is far from the first incident of speech suppression at Northern. The following is a brief history of similar events that have occurred at our beloved university. It is far from exhaustive, but serves to give a bit of historical context to current events.

**Spring, 1996** - Former professor Doug Giebel posts handbills on the campus bulletin boards, promoting an upcoming conference to be held at Northern. Stephen Sylvester, an administrative rival of Giebel's, tears down several of the handbills.

Fall, 1999 - Giebel writes a letter to the Northern Light's editor, Rob Everingham in regards to his ongoing case against Sylvester. The Light prints and distributes the issue containing this letter. Shortly thereafter, a large number those issues disappear; they are later found in a nearby garbage. Mr. Everingham refuses to speculate on the identity of the perpetrator.

**Spring, 2001** - Giebel's case against Sylvester reaches the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. The court ultimately rules unanimously in favor of Giebel, and the case briefly gains national attention.†

**Spring, 2006** - Professor Snyder and a student produce a series of anti-war posters and post them on the general-use billboards around campus. A number of them are torn down by an unknown individual; the culprit remains unconfirmed to this day.

Fall, 2006 - The Northern Light refuses to publish an illustration by staff-artist Cody Lindabury. The Filthy Lucre receives and publishes a copy of the banned comic. ‡
